One: It is Easter,


All: The Day of Resurrection!

Negro Spiritual Royalties Project

The Negro Spiritual, *My Lord, What a Morning,* is used as a refrain throughout our liturgy this morning, and captures the deep feelings of grief, or "mourning" even as hope dawns with the emergence of a new day. It was created by enslaved people, and therefore unprotected by copyright law. We at the United Parish affirm the artistic and spiritual value of all Negro Spirituals by paying royalties with a combination of funds. Royalties go to Hamilton-Garrett Music and Arts, a Boston-based organization dedicated to promoting the advancement of young Black musicians, and to preserving Negro Spirituals, the historic term for this music preferred by Hamilton-Garrett Music and Arts.
